<p>Advantages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nominal charge. • Alliance support. • No data file transfer fees – data already at Alliance data warehouse and reports submitted to the state. • Tailored to meet the state requirements. • Established workflow. • Other care team members portal access. • Training provided. • No upfront costs. • If state requirements change or are enhanced, will be done in the application. • No need to schedule implementation time, only training time. 	<p>Advantages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Integrated with other care providers. • Tailored to meet state requirements. • Provides the IT support for the platform. • Responsible for generating files to submit to the Tailored Plan and to the state. • Can receive files from the Tailored Plan and the state. • Established workflow. 	<p>Advantages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All care managers can use, regardless of member’s tailored plan. • Established workflow. • Can customize to meet your agency’s needs. • Can take in EHR feeds.

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<p>Other considerations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only for use with Alliance members; if you cross tailored plans, will have to use multiple platforms. • Cannot customize to meet individual agency needs 	<p>Other considerations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cost of joining a CIN. • Are there other reports your agency has identified – can you get this data from the CIN? Cost of getting the data. • Can it provide a portal for outside care team members? • May not be able to customize to meet individual agency needs. 	<p>Other considerations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cost of customization to meet the state requirements for assessments, SDoH, etc. • Cost of building, implementing, and transferring file. • Assigning a subject matter expert (SME) in your agency. • Training staff – cost to train and need to assign and keep SME within the agency. • Customization over time with state requirements changes. • Need to consider implementation lead time and who the internal agency implementation lead will be.
