This workshop will provide information, recommendations, and resources necessary to provide intentionally inclusive services to LGBTIQ-identified folks and their families. The facilitator will use a combination of small group discussion, large group discussion, and multimedia presentation to address each of the program objectives.

Target Audience

This program has been planned for Alliance Healthcare staff and providers of mental health, I/DD, and substance use services.

Presenter

Dr. Terri Phoenix, PhD is the Director of the LGBTQ Center at UNC-Chapel Hill. T is an alumnus of East Carolina University (BA), UNC-Greensboro (MS), and University of Georgia (PhD). Terri has served on the Executive Board for the Consortium of Higher Education Resource Professionals and the NC ACLU Transgender Advisory Board. Dr. Phoenix has experience working with youth in various settings including therapeutic group homes, detention centers, psychiatric hospitals, high schools, universities, and non-profit organizations. T has given numerous invited and peer reviewed presentations on cultural competency and inclusive practices at local, regional, and national conferences. Dr. Phoenix lives in Durham, NC and is an avid hiker, kayaker, and motorcyclist.
