### What is EPSDT?

- Early Periodic Screening Diagnostic Treatment is Medicaid's federally mandated comprehensive and preventative child health program for children under 21.
- Purpose is to focus the attention on early prevention and treatment.
- Services include screening, diagnosis, treatment, transportation to and from and assistance with scheduling.

# **EPSDT - Screening**

#### Screening includes:

- Comprehensive health and developmental assessment to include both physical and mental health development and history
- Comprehensive physical exam
- Appropriate immunizations
- Laboratory tests
- Health education including anticipatory guidance
- Vision services
- Dental services
- Hearing services
- Other health care, such as diagnostic services and treatment to correct or ameliorate defects, physical and mental illnesses, and conditioners discovered by the screening services

### **EPSDT - Schedule**

- The schedules used to determine when services are due are from the following:
  - American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Periodicity Schedule

### **EPSDT – Notes About Guidelines**

- All well visits should include, at a minimum, an unclothed physical exam, developmental assessment, anticipatory guidance, and ageappropriate screening and immunizations, as indicated.
- Health education should include counseling for issues and risks factors, as well as inform patients about the benefits of a healthy lifestyle, safety practice/accident avoidance and disease prevention.
- Screenings are recommended by AAP and AAPD. An initial screening may be done at any time, even if the patient's age does not correspond with periodicity schedule.
- If you are not receiving your monthly panel members that are past due, contact your Provider Network Specialist.

# **EPSDT – Other Coding Tips**

- ICD-10 codes if a problem is found, use appropriate code as the secondary diagnosis – DO NOT change the coding from a well visit to a sick visit; use modifier 25
- Use antigen codes along with immunization administration codes.
- Referral codes must be included.

If the child comes in sick but an EPSDT services was provided, can a well – care claim and a sick-child claim be submitted the same day?

Yes, use a Modifier 25 on the applicable E&M code.
